Unlimit your business with Google Drive for Work

What's new: At Google I/O, we announced Google Drive for Work—a new premium offering for businesses, designed to keep all your work safe, available everywhere, and easy to share. Google Drive for Work combines the familiar storage, sync, and share experience of Google Drive with new admin controls, advanced file audit reporting, and eDiscovery services. Key features include:

Unlimited storage

• Unlimited storage for all employees, including files up to 5 TB in size

New audit reporting

 New audit reporting so admins can monitor activity (moving, deleting, or sharing files) within (or outside) the company. As an added bonus, it comes with an audit API that makes this data available to developers

New security controls and content encryption at rest

- New security controls for admins to configure sync client, offline, Drive app, and add-on settings at the organizational unit (OU) level
- All files uploaded to Google Drive are now encrypted for all users (<u>including consumers and all Google Apps for Business customers</u>)—so your content is encrypted not only from your device to Google and in transit between Google data centers, but also at rest on Google servers

Compliance search and discovery with Google Apps Vault

 Includes Google Apps Vault, which <u>has been expanded to provide search for all content</u> stored in Drive

How to get it: Google Drive for Work is now available for new and existing Google Apps for Business customers for \$10/user/month, as part of a new product called <u>Google Apps Unlimited</u>.



Work together

Move to trash directly within Google Docs, Sheets, and Slides

What's new: Owners of a document, spreadsheet, or presentation are now able to move it to the trash from within its own **File** menu.

How it works: Use the **File** menu > **Move to trash** option within the file that you're editing, rather than doing it from the Drive home page. Editors and viewers can see the option in the File menu, but it will be inactive and grayed out.


Suggested Edits for Google Docs

Released June 25, 2014

Share with your users

What's new: People love using Docs because it's so easy to work together in one place, rather than editing and sharing feedback by emailing around multiple versions of the same document. But sometimes you'd simply prefer others make suggestions that you can accept or reject later.

Now in Google Docs, any user with "Can comment" access to a document can use the new **Suggested Edits** feature.



Suggested Edits — a new way to collaborate in Docs

How it works: The suggested edits will appear in the document along with a comment explaining the edit. Users with "Can edit" permission can accept or reject those suggested edits. Users with "Can view" access cannot see suggested edits (until they're accepted). Viewers will also no longer be able to see regular comments, which is a change from previous behavior.





What's new: The Google Drive mobile apps for Android and iOS now have a cleaner design, more responsive animations, and faster background syncing. Sharing your files is also simpler and faster.

Key features include:

- Activity view—A stream of changes to your files and folders, accessible through the details panel
- **Link sharing**—Easily share files and folders directly from the mobile app using a link



How it works: The Google Slides app makes it easier for you to quickly find, edit, and create presentations on the go—online or offline. The Slides app includes support for editing Microsoft® PowerPoint via Quickoffice. No worry about file compatibility—it all just works.




Seamless editing of Office files in Google Docs and Sheets apps


Released June 25, 2014



What's new: Quickoffice has been integrated directly into the Google Docs and Sheets apps on Android and iOS, allowing for seamless editing of Microsoft Word and Excel files.

How it works: Sometimes you receive files that you need to open, edit, and send back. If your recipients don't use Docs, Sheets, and Slides, it can be a usability challenge. Now you no longer have to worry, because the mobile apps for Docs and Sheets let you edit Office files—without conversion—so you can edit and send back files in their original format.



Edit Office files in Chrome and ChromeOS

What's new: Google Apps users can now edit Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint files directly from Google Drive, Gmail, and the new Docs, Sheets, and Slides home screens, without needing Microsoft Office.



How it works: For ChromeOS users, there's nothing to install—it just works. Chrome users for Mac and Windows can install the **Office Editing for Docs, Sheets & Slides** extension and you're good to go.

Simple to use

Improved editing, ease of use, and accessibility in Google Sites



What's new: Several improvements were made to Google Sites—ranging from new keyboard shortcuts for editors to image and header editing enhancements—giving users more control over the overall look and feel of their Sites.

Highlights:

- **New keyboard shortcuts for editors—**Several new options, including **Alt+Shift+F** for opening the editor toolbar. See the <u>full keyboard shortcut list</u>.
- Image editing—Editors can now also set image width to 100 percent of the screen width
- Customize the font, color, and size of lower-level headers (H2, H3, and H4)—In your Site's settings, select Manage Sites, and go to the Themes, Colors, and Fonts section. You'll see that the tab dedicated to the Content area now has new Headers options:

What's new: We launched several features aimed at improving integration between Google Sites and other products.

How it works:

 Google Analytics support on Sites has been improved to support <u>Universal analytics</u>.


What's new: When previewing Gmail attachments in Chrome, certain Chrome extensions can now be queried to determine if they are enabled for Drive.

How it works: If the user has Chrome extensions enabled for Drive, the extensions will be included in the list of apps available as choices in the **Open with** menu in the attachment viewer:




A faster, redesigned Google Drive

Released June 25, 2014



What's new: Google Drive has a new look and speedier performance on the desktop, making organizing and sharing files faster and easier than ever. This new version is rolling out progressively to rapid release domains, who can opt-in and try the new features and interface. Scheduled release domains will be able to opt-in in July. The plan is to roll out the new Drive interface to everyone in the near future.



How it works: Users can now right-click a file to see recent activity, set sharing permissions, and enable files to be accessed while offline. When selecting multiple files, users can take actions on the entire group in three ways—right-click the selection, use the menu above the file area, or simply drag the group to move to a new folder location.


Improved attachment viewing experience in Gmail and Google Drive

How it works: The toolbar has moved to the top (and disappears when not in use) and the document/image frame is now wider, providing a more streamlined experience.


Deeper insights with the redesigned Admin Reports

What's new: We introduced a new redesigned Reports section to the Admin console to make it easier for admins to not only manage Google Apps, but gain insights that help their entire organization run more efficiently.

The new reporting section offers domain highlights, user-level reporting, custom filtering and sorting on data, and new audit streams (Login Audit).








Admin action needed for existing G+ service users

What's new: Google+ Premium features are now automatically enabled for any new customers that enable the Google+ service. In the near future, we will be enabling Premium features for all existing customers as well.

This change gives Google Apps admins access to a number of great business-specific features, making it even easier for your users to share and collaborate with each other, while ensuring that confidential information stays inside your organization.



How it works: These changes allow organizations do two things: first, you'll have a more tailored Google+ experience with enhanced control options, like making Google+ posts restricted to your domain by default or the ability to hide employee profiles in external searches.

Second, you can save time and money while meeting face-to-face with colleagues using 15-person HD video calls with Google Hangouts. So the next time you need to quickly chat with a colleague or hash out a decision, you can just jump into a Hangout with one click from Calendar or an email invitation.


Note: Enabling Premium features disables the Hangouts on Air (HOA) service by default. As such, customers currently using HOA but who have not <u>activated</u> Premium features should do so now, or re-enable HOA once Premium features are the new default (later in July).

Additional audit logging for Marketplace apps usage

Released June 16, 2014

What's new: In an effort to maximize visibility for domain admins, we started logging admin actions related to Google Apps Marketplace (GAM) apps in the Admin console.



How it works: Admins can now view logs tracking when they install (or uninstall) a GAM app and when they grant (or revoke) data grants for an app. Admins can view this data in the Reporting section of the Admin console.


What's new: The Google Apps Migration for Microsoft Exchange (GAMME) tool now supports Outlook 2013 (but not Click-to-Run editions). This latest release also included several bug fixes.

Exclude email drafts from Google Vault search with one click

What's new: Admins can now easily exclude email drafts from searches in Google Vault:



How it works: Simply check the **Exclude drafts** box in the search panel to exclude draft emails from your search.

SMTP relay service enhancements

Released June 23, 2014

What's new: Several enhancements to the SMTP relay service were launched. Admins will benefit from the new features below, giving them more control and security.

How it works:

- Multiple authentication configurations—Admins can now configure multiple sets of authentication rules. For instance, you can specify that messages sent from one IP address are always allowed, messages from another IP address are only allowed if encrypted with TLS, and messages from another IP address range require SMTP AUTH.
- **SMTP AUTH**—This newly supported authentication method uses Google "application-specific passwords" to allow admins to configure clients to authenticate to the relay service. This feature is available for registered Google Apps users only.
- IP range description field—To manage IP addresses more efficiently, admins can enter descriptions in text fields for each IP address or range that you use to set authentication rules.
- Selective enable or disable of IP ranges—Admins can selectively enable or disable IP ranges approved for relay as needed

Better spam management with Message Center


Released June 23, 2014



What's new: Building on the quarantine summary feature launched earlier this year, we have launched Message Center. Message Center is a web-based spam management system designed for Google Apps customers who relay some or all of their email traffic to on-premise SMTP servers.

How it works: Message Center provides the following features:

- Ability to view and search 30 days of clean/spam mail
- Ability to mark single or multiple messages as spam or not spam
- Delivery of messages that are *not spam* to the on-premise mailbox
- Addition and removal of contacts for whitelisting purposes
- Bookmarkable URLs for searches and individual messages

Google Apps Vault now searches Google Drive content

Released June 25, 2014



What's new: Google Apps Vault's robust functionality now includes another data source—Drive—so that organizations can find even more business-critical content. Vault for Drive comes at no additional cost for Vault customers and works with existing Drive content in users' accounts. Postini customers transitioning to Vault can also use Vault for Drive at no additional cost once the transition is complete.

How it works: With Vault for Drive, organizations can search for specific users' Drive files (including both Google documents and other stored files), preview search results in Vault to make sure customers find just what they need, and create copies of search results and export them for future use.

For new customers, Vault is now included with <u>Google Apps Unlimited</u>, or you can buy Vault licenses for an additional \$5 per user, per month.

Note: Setting retention policies, creating holds, and conducting domain-wide searches for Drive content are not available at this time.

Restore a user's Google Drive files

Released June 25, 2014

What's new: To avoid unintended data loss, admins can now restore a given user's deleted Google Drive files for a specified date range.

How it works: This feature helps ensure that, if a user accidentally deletes important files, those files are not permanently lost. The feature pertains to files that have been emptied from the Trash only. Files still in the Trash can be easily recovered by the user.
